Andrea De Siena is a dancer originally from San Vito dei Normanni (Puglia, Italy). He has participated in several festivals such as 'La Notte della Taranta' in 2014 with choreographer Miguel Angel Berna. He is a dancer in the Orchestra Popolare Italiana directed by Ambrogio Sparagna and collaborates with the Orchestra Popolare del Saltarello. In 2016, Andrea De Siena danced in the show "Japan Orfeo" in Tokyo and Kamakura directed by Stefano Vizioli and Aaron Carpenè. He teaches traditional dances in Rome and in various locations around the Mediterranean (Barcelona, Milan, Paris, Naples, Nantes, Bethlehem); since 2016, he has been directing the Pizzica School of San Vito and in 2022 he founded the Roma Trad collective with other dancers. In 2022, he won the Ethnos Gener/Azioni Choreographic Award with a piece entitled TRADERE.

FABIO CICCALÈ



Choreographer, dancer, and Italian performer. He graduated in Painting from the Academy of Fine Arts in Macerata and from the E. Cecchetti School of Acting-Dance-Singing in Civitanova Marche. He has collaborated with Compagnia Alhena, Compagnia Enzo Cosimi, Compagnia La bilancia Produzioni, Compagnia Nuova Euroballetto, and Compagnia Giuseppina Von Bingen. Since 2002, he has been choreographing and dancing for the company FC@PIN.D'OC now PinDoc. In 2010, he collaborated in creating and dancing in the choreographies of Roberto Castello (C.ia Aldes) for the Fazio/Saviano program Vieni via con me on RAI 3. His most recent solo, "Canto pop," of which he will present an excerpt at Crossings, is "a carousel of choreutic splinters mainly related to the greatest music hits of the 'mythical' sixties. Ciccalè doesn't hold back: 'Bang bang,' 'Perdono,' 'Io ho in mente te,' 'Sono una donna non sono una santa,' and other hits from that era. Ciccalè entertains on the edge of pre-show without giving the impression of aiming to entertain. 'Canto pop' is an intelligent and original operation that surprises and doesn't fade from memory" (by I.Interesse).

ORLY PORTAL



Orly Portal is a dancer, choreographer, dance teacher, movement and voice therapist, researcher of tribal dance and Moroccan folklore, and developer of a unique dance language. A graduate of the Dance Studies programme at the Jerusalem Academy of Music and Dance, she began her professional career as a dancer and soloist in the Kol VeDama ensemble under the direction of Moshe Efrati and the Bat Sheva Ensemble. Portal is one of the founders of the Improvisation Ensemble, which focuses on the study of the art of improvisation. She studied Arabic music at Bar-Ilan University and travelled to Morocco to learn the original dances of the Gnawa and Amazigh tribes. In her 25-year career as a dancer and choreographer, she has performed on many stages and festivals in Israel and around the world, collaborating with leading artists in various fields.

Patricia Alvarez is an independent dancer and researcher of movement and gesture in Mediterranean and Atlantic cultural traditions. Trained in different types of dances - Arabic dances, flamenco, contemporary dance, classical dance, Afro-Mandinga dance - and in other body techniques such as Pilates, yoga and dance theatre, and with a degree in Arabic Philology and Islam (UAM), she develops her work in different areas. She proposes an interdisciplinary approach, with the body and movement as the central axis, articulating different forms and methodologies of work, linking dance, writing and research. With a critical perspective on the use of dance for social, political and cultural purposes and a particular interest in postcolonial, inclusive and feminist thought, she understands dance not only as art but also as a space for knowledge and reflection.
